Chair Letter

Cama'i Fellow Tribal Members,

I hope this finds you and your family safe and healthy during the incredibly difficult time caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. I also hope you were able to enjoy the summer and spend some time appreciating warm weather. Now, here we are in fall, the Kodiak landscape is mostly brown, and snow is in the forecast. I am planning to catch up on indoor chores, enjoy reading some good books, and get outside as weather permits.



On behalf of the council, I would like to say Quyanaa to all the tribal members and guests who participated in the very first virtual annual meeting on September 19th. Despite not being able to gather as we usually do, we had a good turnout. We appreciate the adaptability, and willingness to help keep one another safe by participating remotely. We hope to continue allowing for teleconference and/or video conference attendance in the future because it was very nice to have several out of town members attending this year. I would like to congratulate my fellow council members, Natasha Hayden and Kenneth Nelson, who were re-elected; and I would like to express my gratitude for also being re-elected to the council. I will continue to serve our people with pride.

I would like to thank Sean Hales for running for a council seat. I believe that he is an impressive young man who already has experience working with our Alutiiq people. Although he was not elected, I hope that he will consider running again. It is always encouraging to see our younger tribal members express interest in the governance of our tribe.

In late March, we decided to cancel the traditional Dig Afognak camp and to take a new direction in direct response to COVID-19. Instead of the in-person camp we all know and love, staff hosted the first ever virtual Dig Afognak Camp. The resiliency of our youth was amazing, as they adapted to a new version of Dig Afognak. Four virtual camps were held with a total of 86 participants throughout the entire summer. From perok making to mask painting, each camp was more successful than the last. More importantly our youth were able to feel a connection to one another and our culture while participating in each camp. At the end of each camp, there was a drawing for mini prizes with a grand prize drawing at the end of the season. Congratulations to our grand prize winners, Kayley Simmons and Alyssa Mullan!

As we enter the end of the year, I'd like to remind everyone to check in with one another. Be kind and remember that together we can make any situation easier. If you or someone you know is struggling, don't hesitate to reach out to a friend or family member. Stay safe and be well!

Virtual Dig Afognak 2020



Due to COVID-19 NVA made the decision early on for everyone's health and safety to cancel our annual Dig Afognak camps for 2020. This was the first time the Native Village of Afognak has not held the Dig Afognak summer camps. Quickly adjusting to this new way of living has been tough on all of us, but especially the kids. We collaborated with a few teachers and with the help of the two Rural Cap Grants and some Dig Afognak funds, we were able to offer to our youth "Virtual Dig Afognak Camps".

The way Virtual Camp worked was quite simple. NVA provided all supplies needed for each activity in individual kits. There was an application put out every other week specific to each activity. Every camp had a deadline for applications, and since we were not able to work with the students directly they provided a photo submission of their finished projects and if they submitted their photo by the deadline (which varied between each camp depending on the activity), they would be entered in for a gift card drawing at the close of that camp. There were 5 randomly selected winners after each activity ended.

There was a total of 4 virtual camps which included rock painting, shadowboxing, perok making, and mask painting with each averaging approximately 22 participants. We had a total of 86 participants throughout the entire summer. There was a total of 20 gift cards distributed and 2 grand prize winners.

We are working on continuing activities like the ones in our Virtual Camp for the kids during these hard times to help keep them active and engaged. We are currently working on a Geo Caching activity for the near future. We have also purchased a Go-Pro and drone to be able to share Alutiiq Dancing and other things like seal hunting and traditional food processing with the students virtually this fall. We also have a paddle painting activity for adults in the works with teachers Hanna and Gage Sholl.

Lastly, The Native Village of Afognak would like to give a huge thank you to our 2 teachers Phyllis Clough who created a tutorial video for us on how to make perok, and Sara Squartsoff-Mckinley who put together mask painting kits on canvas. We greatly appreciate everything they have done.

KEEP MOISTURE OUT

- Put lids on pots when cooking
- Dry clothes outside
- Vent your clothes dryer to the outside
- Air your house on fine days
- Use extractor fans or open windows in the kitchen and bathroom to remove moisture
- Remove mould using very diluted household bleach
- Check for water leaks from guttering and plumbing and repair them
- Ensure there is adequate drainage around your house
- Black plastic on the ground under the house will keep it drier and easier to heat
- Consider double glazing if you are building or replacing windows

KEEP HEAT IN

- Have well-fitting curtains and keep them closed at night
- Use draught stops under doors and draught-proof windows
- Insulate your ceiling and under the floor

40% of heat can be lost through an uninsulated ceiling

KEEP AIR CLEAN

- Make your home smokefree
- Use an electric or flued* gas heater
- Limit the use of strong-smelling cleaners, air fresheners and flysprays, and ventilate the room after using them
- Dust with a damp cloth or microfibre cloth
- Use a sealed vacuum with a HEPA** filter and vacuum regularly
- Keep pets out of the bedroom
- Use low VOC*** paints
- Use heaters and ventilation systems with a high-grade filter
- Use antimicrobial treated pillows and mattresses

Save money and improve energy efficiency



*flued means the heater has a vent to safely carry away emissions
 **HEPA means high efficiency particulate air
 ***VOC means volatile organic compounds




